Policy:

As of December 1, 2013, **Flight crews, support staff and visitors** are to wear HI-VIS vests at all times when they are on the ramp (airside). This is for their own safety, the safety of others and to conform to local (EASA) airport regulations. Crewmembers who do not comply risk losing their airport security passes and may face possible disciplinary action by the company for continued infringements. High visibility clothing is to be removed when inside the aircraft due to their flammable nature. For all flights, the vests are to be securely stowed so they don't present a "loose article" risk or a "glare" risk.
