

FIF 13-011 UNAUTHORIZED MANEUVERS IN CAE OAA AIRCRAFT

Unauthorized maneuvers are **STRICTLY FORBIDDEN** IN CAE OAA aircraft.

These include the following:

- **AEROBATICS**
- **FORMATION FLYING**
- **LOW LEVEL FLYING** (With the exception of making a Take Off from or Landing to an airfield)

These maneuvers are in breach of CAE OAA policy, the Operations Manual, Type Certification of the Aircraft, National Authorities Regulations and pose a **significant Flight Safety Risk**. Any person found to be conducting these maneuvers **INTENTIONALLY** will be subject to disciplinary action and immediate termination from training or from the company.

Remember:

(91.303) Aerobatic flight- intentional maneuver involving an abrupt change in an aircraft's attitude, abnormal attitude, or abnormal acceleration, not necessary for normal flight

(91.307) (c) Unless each occupant of the aircraft is wearing an approved parachute, no pilot of a civil aircraft carrying any person (other than a crewmember) may execute any intentional maneuver that exceeds--

(1) A bank of 60 degrees relative to the horizon; or

(2) A nose-up or nose-down attitude of 30 degrees relative to the horizon
