Background:

CAE OAA is committed to achieving the highest level of safety by meeting or surpassing regulatory requirements, by auditing the safety implications of our activities, by identifying areas for improvement through incident reporting, investigation and risk assessment, and by encouraging the open and honest reporting of safety issues.

Policy:

As of December 1, 2013, flight crews, support staff and visitors are to wear high visibility vests at all times when they are on any ramps (airside) and complete the ramp safety briefing (found at Dispatch) prior to entering the ramp area. This is for their own safety, the safety of others and to conform to Company regulations. Crewmembers who do not comply may face possible disciplinary action by the company for continued infringements. High visibility clothing is to be removed when inside the aircraft due to their flammable nature. For all flights, the vests are to be securely stowed so they don't present a "loose article" risk or a "glare" risk.

Exceptions and Review:

The above policies apply to all CAE OAA PHX flight operations and will be reviewed annually.

Scope:

All CAE OAA Phoenix flights.
